1. **GET + noun** - to talk about obtaining and buying things, taking transport and catching illnesses. [6]

2. **GET + adverb** - to talk about arriving or the end of a movement [3]

3. **GET + object + past participle** - to talk about things that others do for us [1]

4. **GET + adjective** - to talk about a change of state or to become [3]

5. **GET + -ing + adjective** - to talk about gradual development or change [2]

Multi-part Verbs (phrasal verbs) with GET

6. **GET + particle** - to pass an obstacle by climbing it [1]

7. **GET + particle** - to release yourself or someone from a
place/situation [2]

8. **GET + particle** - to move to a higher position [1]

9. **GET + particle** - to enter [1]

10. **GET + particle + particle + object** - to re-enter [1]

11. **GET + infinitive with 'to'** - to achieve something [1]
